Currently there are 3 types of videos you can embed in your webpage. Depending on the type of browser that the user is using, the proper format will be selected automatically:

## Converting the Video

Online converters

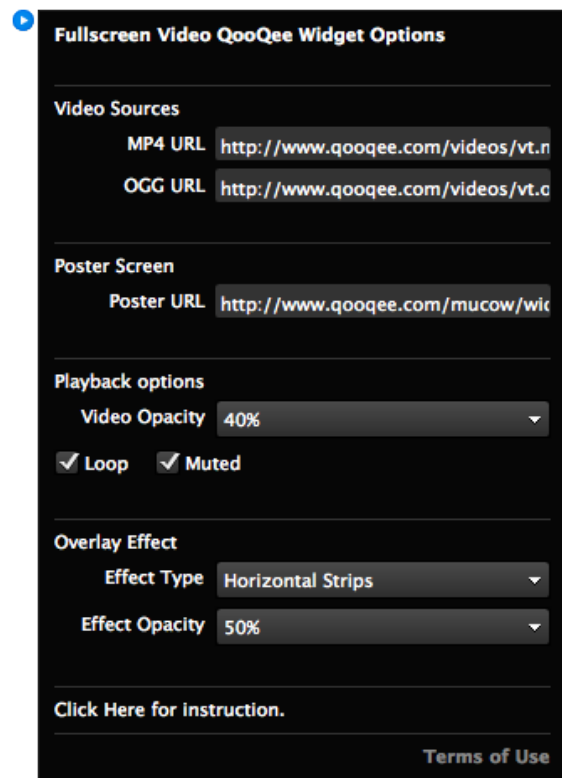
Use the links below and convert your video. You can use any video converter installed on your machine, to convert the videos.

- ◇ If there is a video on YouTube or Vimeo that you want to use, go to this link (<http://www.clipconverter.cc>) to convert it into .MP4 Download the converted video (.mp4 file). Then use the links above and convert it to .WEBM and .OGV files.

## Getting the widget ready in Muse

1. Drag the widget into the page from the library panel.
2. Click on the circular blue icon on the top-right side of the widget (while it is selected).

3. Upload the file to your FTP host (read the next page for more instruction), and enter the file URL in the widget option.



- You can specify the address to the file in two formats, you either put them beside the content of your website in a folder like videos/test.mp4 or you can host them in a different location and put the full URL pointing to the file  
e.g `http://www.qooqee.com/videos/test.mp4`.

- Please have in mind HTTP:// is mandatory if you are using a URL.
- You can also add the videos in Muse (*File / Add files for upload*). It places the files in your Assets folder after you upload your site into FTP host.
  - e.g The address for .MP4 should be like this  
<http://www.yoursite.com/assets/videoname.mp4>

## Widget options

- ❖ Regarding how to use the options Widthy Widget, using the checkboxes on top of the options page you can:
  - autoplay: specifies that the video will start playing as soon as it is ready
  - controls: specifies that video controls should be displayed (such as a play/pause button etc).
  - loop: specifies that the video will start over again, every time it is finished
  - muted: specifies that the audio output of the video should be muted
  
- ❖ poster is where you can specify an image to be shown while the video is downloading, or until the user hits the play button. (\*You can also select the video and add a background image directly in Muse and it will be used as the poster image).
  
- ❖ using the overflow drop-down menu, you can specify what should happen if the content of Widget window exceeds the size you specify.
  
- ❖ Border Style drop-down menu allows you to set the style for container's border which you can set in Muse.
